WHAT IS VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION?

Mission Statement

The Shoshone-Paiute Tribes Vocational Rehabilitation Project (SPTVR) assists American Indians with Disabilities who live in the SPTVR geographic service area of Idaho and Nevada. The objective of SPTVR is to provide vocational rehabilitation services to consumers through “informed choice” where an individual’s strengths, priorities, concerns, and abilities are respected, and the outcome is gainful employment in a competitive market.

Eligibility and Process

You are eligible for services, if you:

- Are a Sho-Pai Tribal Member or a enrolled member of a Federally recognized American Indian Tribe or an Alaskan Native
- Reside in the geographic service area of Idaho and Nevada
- Have a mental or physical impairment that is making it difficult for you to get or keep a job
- The services provided would help you become successfully employed

APPLICATION PROCESS:

- Consumer is informed of rights and obligations
- Application, intake, and release forms are completed by consumer and VR Counselor
- The development of an Individual Plan of Employment (IPE)
- VR Counselor will review the application
- Referrals to other agencies may be made
- Eligibility, this maybe extended to 60 days for determination, or as needed
