SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

This position is subject to random drug testing and a background check as a condition of employment. This individual operates Tribal vehicles and equipment on a regular basis. This person comes into close contact with children and seniors in the course of delivering service to the community. This individual works in hazardous environments (machinery, electricity, chemicals).

JOB SUMMARY:

Under the supervision of the Fish Biologist and Fish, Wildlife and Parks Director, the incumbent will perform the following job duties related to the Duck Valley Fisheries Operations and Maintenance.

SPECIFIC DUTIES:

1. Responsible for safe operation and maintenance of FW&P department equipment including, but not limited to, hand tools, gas-powered generators, motorboat, canoe, chainsaws, augers, electro shockers, water quality meters, etc.
2. Responsible for the proper care and safe operation of tribal vehicles, including ATVs and motor boat, and repair and Maintain equipment.
3. Collects biological information relating to water quality, fisheries, wildlife, aquatic invertebrates, vegetation, etc. at reservoirs, riparian habitats on Duck Valley Indian Reservation.
4. Assists technical or professional personnel in performing various routine field and/or laboratory tests employing standard biological techniques.
5. Must effectively interact and communicate with the public, ask questions regarding angling experience on the lake, accurately record angler answers, biological data, and check tribal membership/fishing permits, etc.
6. Conduct wildlife, fishery and vegetation surveys, evaluations, and monitoring.
7. Aid supervisor in collection and organization of field data.
8. Assists in campground repairs and maintenance, fence building/maintenance and road maintenance around reservoirs.
9. Apply herbicides to undesirable plant species under the supervision of trained Fish, Wildlife and Parks staff.
10. Must be willing to work weekends as assigned.
11. Will perform other related duties as assigned by supervisor.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

1. Qualified candidates must be able to swim.
2. Training/experience in boat and canoe is preferred.
3. Experience with sampling methods is preferred.
4. Must be a high school graduate or GED equivalent.
5. Must have a valid state (Idaho or Nevada) driver's license.
6. Must be physically able to perform the job duties.
7. Must be willing to work in adverse weather conditions.
8. Must work with minimal supervision and able to communicate effectively with co-workers.
9. Must be willing to work a flexible schedule *which will require weekend work* and/or working more than 8 hours per day.
10. Weed applicators license is preferred or willingness to obtain such license.
