SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS: This position is subject to random drug testing and a background check as a condition of employment. This individual has access to sensitive Tribal and personal data. This position oversees the fiscal management of the Tribal Administrator's Office for the Shoshone-Paiute Tribes and must meet the conditions to be bonded. Additionally, this person periodically operates a Tribal vehicle (Unless excepted under the provisions of the American Disabilities Act).

JOB FUNCTION:

Under the director supervision of the Tribal Chairman, the Tribal Projects & Natural Resources Administrator shall be responsible for monitoring and carrying out the administrative functions of the Shoshone-Paiute Projects & Natural Resources Programs.

SPECIFIC DUTIES:

1. Reviews deliverables prepared and gives direction.
2. Prepares for agency reviews and quality assurance procedures.
3. Tracks and reports hours and expenses as required by project scope.
4. Reviews Grant and Contract applications and reapplications for compliance with all regulations and for the delivery of measurable products or services, prior to presentation to the Business Council.
5. Analyzes project profitability, revenue, margins, bill rates and utilization.
6. Understands basic revenue models, profit/loss, and cost-to-completion projections and makes decisions accordingly.
7. Has direct supervisory responsibility over all programs under the Tribal Projects & Natural Resources Division.
8. Leads Proposal Effort including completing project scoping and assessments.
9. Possesses understanding in the areas of computer application programming, database, blueprints and system design.
10. Will perform other related duties as assigned by immediate supervisor.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

1. Master's degree in Business or Public Administration or related field, preferred.
2. Bachelor's degree in Business or Public Administration or a related field.
3. Must be familiar with Federal and State regulations related to Grants & Contracts Administration.
4. At least three (3) years' experience in the area of Administration of Federal and State programs.
5. Must have knowledge of the Indian community, its needs and organization (preferred).
6. Must be able to communicate effectively and relate to the Indian community, Tribal leaders, as well as representatives of Federal and State agencies.
7. Any combination of experience or training, which would indicate capability and required knowledge in the administrative area, maybe considered.
