

**Request for Proposal:
WELL ASSESSMENT
April 2, 2021**

INTRODUCTION:

The Shoshone-Paiutes of the Duck Valley Indian Reservation are accepting bids to provide the well assessments for the two existing water wells to be performed in the months of May or June 2021. The wells have approved state of Nevada water rights permits for quasi-municipal use, but are currently inactive. Both wells have limited data on well construction and pump information. A general outline of tasks that could be required for well assessment/rehabilitation includes but not limited to: 1) Pull pumps and inspect well systems (discharge head, pump, column pipe assembly, electric wiring, tanks, and/or any other pumping/storage equipment and materials); 2) Video survey (it will help in determining the integrity of the casing/screen and general downhole conditions of the well); 3) Well assessment report (with recommendation on necessary repairs, changes and modifications needed to make each well and water system operable); 4) Perform necessary operations as determined in previous steps to make the well operational (may include brushing, cleaning, parts replacement, another video survey, test pumping, etc.). Task number 4, can be done in next stage of the work, please provide two bids one for tasks 1,2 and 3; and another for task 4. The flexibility of time by a few months earlier or after the specified time can be accommodated.

LOCATION:

The Duck Valley Indian Reservation is a rectangular area approximately 20 miles long and 20 miles wide that straddles the Idaho-Nevada border. The specific location of the project is about 80 miles North of Elko, NV on Nevada State Route 225 or 113 miles South of Mountain Home, ID on Idaho State Route 51/Nevada State Route 225. Idaho State Route 51/Nevada State Route 225, is a paved north-south highway, the project is located directly adjacent to the highway.

CONTRACTOR QUALIFICATIONS:

Contractors bidding this work shall have current license as follows: Contractors license.
Contractors bidding this type of work shall provide recent work history similar to this type of work, for the last 5 years, with names and telephone numbers to allow the Owner to contact them to discuss past work performance.

BID PREPARATION:

The Shoshone-Paiutes of the Duck Valley Indian Reservation will receive bids for said work as described herein by the close of business on April 25, 2021. The time frame of the project will be based on weather conditions, but is preferred to commence as soon as possible or as weather conditions allow.

Bids can be sent via USPS, UPS, or FedEx to the Natural Resources Building at the Tribal Headquarter complex, “**Attn: Pawan Upadhyay – Well Assessment Bid Enclosed**” on the outside of the envelope. Mailed bids will be accepted at: PO Box 219, Owyhee, NV 89832. Bids must contain the signature by a company representative approved to represent the company. Hard copies with original signatures must be provided at the time of the contract signing. Please indicate earliest contractor availability in the bid. Successful bidder will be required to sign a standard Tribal contract for the entire scope of work. Contractor must retain records for audit purposes for a minimum of 5 years. Trash/debris disposal is a requirement of the Contractor, and shall be done under a lawful method. All work is to comply with Idaho and Nevada building codes.

The Tribes reserve the right to accept or reject any or all portions of a bid, at their sole discretion. Further, the Tribes accept no responsibility for any costs involved in preparing or submitting a bid.

FUNDING:

Funding is provided by federal funding and no other funds are available. Davis-Bacon Wage Rates will be required. Certified payroll must be submitted to TERO – contact John Crum at (208)759-3100 ext. 1234 or crum.johna@shopai.org.

Contractor must comply with Tribal TERO ordinance through contact listed above.
