Shoshone Paiute Emergency Operation Center is Operational in support of Owyhee Community Health Facility – the EOC phone number is 775-757-2192 – Donations Center 775-757-2170 it is operational Monday thru Saturday 8 am to 5 pm.

Continued dissemination of factual and update information of COVID-19 information will be placed at public locations throughout the reservation for the duration of the Emergency.

The EOC staff will be implementing new radio messages and weekly information packets to further provide community information.

Senior Citizen program has stopped delivery of hot meals except to elders previously on the list. Drive thru service will continue.

Needs assessments have been performed by OCHF staff for quarantined individuals. Dispersal of needs items to affected individuals have taken place from the EOC.

Plans are being developed by EOC staff to address future concerns. These are implementing more safety measures at OUR STORE to prevent the spread or getting the virus.

Continued communication with state and federal agencies on daily updates and assistance availability are being conducted by the SPTEOC and OCHF

PPE (mask, gloves, hand sanitizer) is available for pick up at the EOC for Community Members going out of town for essential items.

EOC is taking daily temperatures of tribal employees before employees enter their work facilities.

The EOC will be delivering food boxes that were donated from FISH (Friends in Serving Helping).

EOC provided outdoor recreational items to DV families.

EOC Contact tracing team is working with each other and OCHF to better engage the community about the disease, how to protect individuals and how to suppress transmission.
