R e a d t h e L a b e l F i r s t !!

Injury to a child is a parent's worst nightmare. Many common household products such as cleaners and pesticides could hurt a child if not used and stored correctly. Prevent children from being exposed to household cleaners and pesticides is your responsibility.

Read the Label First!!

- How to use the product responsibly
- How to store the product safely
- First Aid instructions
- Phone number to call for help or more information

Follow ALL Label Instructions

- Warnings and directions for use tell where you can use the products and how to use them responsibly. This helps keep you and your children safe.
- Follow warnings to wear protective clothing and not breathe product dust or fumes.
- Keep children and pets away from spills and treated areas as directed

Keep Products In Their Original Containers

- It is very dangerous to put pesticides in food and beverage containers. Children think that something in a familiar juice or soda bottle is okay to

- If you throw away the original container, you throw away important information needed about the product, how to use it and what to do in a case of an emergency
- Whenever possible, buy ready-to-use products. If the label tells you to mix a product in another container, use up all of the mixture. Only mix the amount that you need to do the job.

KEEP Products Out of The Reach of Children:

- Make sure all your household cleaning and pesticide products are stored where children can't reach them
- Use of childproof locks on low cabinets and make certain child-resistant caps and covers are in place
- Teach your child that household products are not toys!

Prevent Environmental

- Applying product where it could run into ponds creeks or other water supplies can contaminate drinking water and kill fish and other aquatic life.
- Apply products according to the label directions is necessary to prevent harm to the environment
- Never pour any pesticides including lawn and garden products down the drain

Save Money By Reading Labels

- Buy the right product for the job
- Buy only the amount you need
- Use the right amount of product for the job

Follow These Tips When Selecting and Using Pesticides

Identify the Problem— know the problem is the first step toward solving it

Find the Product that Solves the Problem— Read the label to make sure that pesticide can be used in the desired location and to control the pest. Some products might not work as well if stored for long periods of time. A larger size might not be a good value if you can't use it.

Use the Product the Right Way— Product labels tell you how to safely use the products for best results. Use only the amount indicated. More is **NOT** better and can be harm to people, animals and the environment. If you mix a product in another container, use all the mixture and properly rinse and discard.

Pay Attention to Warnings— follow directions about wearing gloves or protective clothing. Understand when and how to apply the product and when it's safe for people or pets to enter treated areas.
